The committee chair will contact the department chair and professor to communicate the requested revisions, and the updated version will be revisited at a future meeting.

V. Writing-Intensive Syllabus Audit: Sarah Skripsky

Sarah Skripsky attended the meeting to review the Writing-Intensive Syllabi Audit report, including its findings and limitations. Discussion entailed suggestions for minor language revisions and clarification on the process for delisting currently approved courses.

Actions steps:

- Sarah Skripsky will revise and finalize the report, which will be sent to department chairs.
 - Department chairs will discuss findings with department members and decide whether and which any courses might be delisted. The process for delisting courses from GE categories is published on the Westmont website, and departments will follow the steps to have courses officially delisted.

• Department chairs will send feedback from their department conversations to the Dean of Curriculum and Educational Effectiveness, who will incorporate the information into the Fall 2024 report to Academic Senate.
